

LFI LEAGUE RULES

Monday and Tuesday night Leagues will be run as one match. Each night will be a different squad. Results from both nights will be sent out on Wednesdays.

Each competitor will be required to select a Division based upon the type of firearm and magazine length used. These divisions are based upon the USPSA published rules. LFI reserves the right to modify the published rules in order to better serve our league. **Safety continues to be the most important aspect of our league. At no time will any rule changes be instituted that will diminish the safety rules in place.**

USPSA rules that relate to holster type and placement along with magazine placement will not be used.

All divisions will be scored as minor.

On the first night of League, shooter must declare which division they will shoot in all four (4) weeks.

Below are the Divisions that will be used in LFI Leagues. We are providing a brief description of the Division. The complete Division description obtained from USPSA is also attached. There must be at least three competitors to win a prize for the division.

Open Division

- Compensators allowed
- Magazine wells allowed
- Ported barrels allowed
- Magazines up to 170mm in length allowed
- Electronic sights allowed

Limited Division

- No compensator
- No barrel porting
- No optics
- Mag well permitted Magazines up to 141.25mm in length allowed

Production Division

- Essentially a stock pistol
- No mag well
- No optic
- Magazine capacity limit of seventeen (17) rounds. (LFI rule, not USPSA)

Carry Optics

- No compensator
- No barrel porting
- No mag well
- Slide mounted optic only
- Magazines up to 141.25mm in length allowed

Pistol Caliber carbine - PCC

Pistol Cartridges only (i.e.: 9mm, 45acp, 40 S&W)

No suppressors

No full auto or binary type triggers.

PCC with arm brace will be allowed (**LFI rule, not USPSA**)

Shooters will be required to carry their PCC to the line cased and unloaded. To be considered cased, the PCC must be in a case or sleeve which covers from the muzzle past the trigger guard and prevents access to or manipulation of the trigger.

Shooters will be required to have a chamber flag inserted prior to coming to the line and prior to the line being called cold.

The start position for the PCC will be "low ready." PCC at 45° pointed down range, safety engaged, finger off the trigger.

Range commands for PCC will be the same with the exception of "If Clear, Hammer Down, Flag" at the end of the course of fire.
